at my decease Item the rest residue and remainder of all and singular my  
Goods Chattels ready money moneyes at Interest plate debts household stuff  
and all and every other my Estate of what nature or kind soever not herein  
before by me given and bequeathed after my just debts the Charge of an  
proving this my will Legacies and other incident Charges shall be thereout  
first paid and discharged I do hereby wholly and solely give devise and  
bequeath unto my said Daughter Elizabeth Marshall her Executors and  
Administrators and I do hereby make ordain nominate and appoint my

in manner following Inprimis I give and devise all that my Copyhold  
or Customary Mesuages or Tenements with the dwell and also all other  
my Copyhold Mesuages or Tenements lands Tenements and  
hereditaments within the Manor of Walton Thames and Walton  
Loigh and elsewhere in the County of Surrey to my loving wife Frances  
for her life and afterwards to my Granddaughter Anne the daughter  
of my late son William Latten deceased and to her heirs and  
assigns for ever Item I give and bequeath to my said loving wife  
all my plate except my silver Soffet pot silver Stalop sugar dish  
silver half pint Cup having on it the mark of a Crook bow and also  
her watch and Ring with give and bequeath to my loving brother  
William Latten of Gray Inn Esquire the yearly sum or payment  
of sixty pounds of lawfull money of Great Britain Item I give  
to my Granddaughter Frances daughter of the daughter of Colonel John  
Bolton by my daughter Robertas his wife the sum of one thousand  
pounds of like lawfull money Item I give and bequeath to Samuel  
Bolton the younger son of Samuel Bolton the elder of Esher in  
the said County of Surrey Esquire two hundred pounds of like  
lawfull money Item I give and bequeath to William the son of  
Sarah Latten the widow of my said late son William five hundred  
pounds of like lawfull money which four last mentioned legacies  
are to be paid as hereafter is mentioned Item I give devise and  
bequeath to my trusty and loving friends Dr James Edwards of Walton  
aforesaid Baronet John Cousmaker of Weybridge in the said County  
of Surrey Esq. and to the said Samuel Bolton the Elder all my  
monies at Interest either in fund or elsewhere my shares and  
parts in Byfleet Drills my pictures and furniture of all sorts and  
all my Goods Chattels and personal Estate whatsoever after my just  
debts and funeral expences are paid and discharged In Trust that  
the said Dr James Edwards John Cousmaker and Samuel Bolton  
the Elder and the survivor of them and the Executors and Admini-  
strators of the survivor of them shall and do out of my said monies  
and out of my shares and parts in Byfleet Drills pay or cause to  
be paid to my said loving brother William Latten the said sixty  
pounds per annum for his life by half yearly payments the first  
payment to be made at the end of six months after my death and  
further to permit and suffer the said pictures and the Goods and  
furniture in and about my said dwelling house after an Inventory or  
particular thereof is taken to remain in their proper places and to be  
used by my said wife for her life along with my house and making good  
the same the common wear and common accidents only excepted and  
after the death of my said wife to deliver over the same to and to  
the use of my said Granddaughter Anne Latten and as concerning  
the said monies and the said shares and parts in Byfleet Drills  
subject to the said payment of the said sixty pounds per annum to  
my said brother for life to permit and suffer my said loving wife  
to receive and take the same for her life by half yearly payments  
and after the death of my said brother and wife then to pay the  
said three money legacies to my said Grand Child Frances  
Bolton to Samuel Bolton the younger and William the said son of the



said Sarah Latton widow three months after the death of the survivor of my said Brother and wife and afterwards to pay over the principal money and interest and parts with the surplus of the interest or product thereof to my said Granddaughter Anne Latton whom I give to my said Trustees two Summes apeece to buy them Rings over and besides their Charges in managing the trust hereby imposed in them which they are hereby empowered to deduct out of the said money and the said interest and parts in Myself Will's Item I do nominate the said Mr. James Edwards John Cousmaker and Samuel Wintrop the Elder Executors of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I the said John Latton have hereunto set my hand and seal to this my last Will and Testament this thirtieth day of October in the first year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second by the Grace of God of Great Britain King Anno Domini 1727. John Latton. signed sealed published and declared in the said Testator in the presence of us who have hereto set our hands as witnesses in the said Testator's presence (the words Francis Robinson to Samuel Wintrop Junior and some few other raisures and Interlineations less material being first interlined and Bigged. the month of March in the  
first year of the said George the second  
the said John Latton late of  
London Esq. deceased left  
and bequeathed by his last  
Will one of the Executors  
named in the said Will also died  
was granted to him Chamberlain  
of the Exchequer the natural  
and lawful Granddaughter and  
heir of the said John Latton  
and the said John Latton  
before either of them took upon  
him the execution thereof having  
been first sworn duly to do so.

and first witeas by a power to me given in and by a deed of rat  
tlement made about the time of my Marriage with Susanna my  
now wife it is therein mentioned that if I should have more Child or  
Children than my eldest son by me to be begotten on the body of my said  
wife that it should in such case be lawfull for me for the preferment  
of such younger Child or Children to charge all or any part of my  
Wife's goods and Tenements in Sutton with the lands thereunto belonging  
with any sum or sums of money not exceeding the sum of five hundred  
pounds I do therefore hereby in pursuance of such power charge all  
and every my said Wife's goods Tenements and Cottages in Sutton with
